War Memorial



The new War Memorial, opposite the Coldra Court Hotel, was dedicated by the Bishop of Monmouth on 3rd June. The event was very well attended and reactions to the memorial from residents and visiting dignitaries

The week before the Dedication, children and teachers from Langstone Primary School filled and buried a time capsule beneath the memorial, to be opened in 50 years' time. It is hoped that some of the children involved will be present when the capsule is unearthed!

At both events we had the honour of hosting Mr Ron Jones, aged 100, who was captured in WW2 and was a prisoner of war in Auschwitz, surviving a 17-week death march before liberation by Allied forces in 1945. His tales were a source of inspiration for young and old alike, and a reminder of the horrors of war.

Defibrillators

The Council has ordered 2 defibrillators to be installed at Llandevaud's old phone-box and at The New Inn, hopefully by the end of July. Additional grant funding is to be sought to fund additional units.

Velothon Wales

The Council set up an unofficial pit-stop at Langstone Village Hall and the break for many riders was most welcome as they took advantage of the toilet facilities, water refills, refreshments and a cycle repair workshop. A few residents also came along and enjoyed a cuppa and cake. Next year, we hope that the Velothon organisers will accept us as an official pit-stop and put us on their map for riders. It's a long way to the next official pit-stop at Usk!
