Road Safety

The Community Speedwatch campaign is going ahead full steam, with several volunteer residents and councillors now trained by Gwent Police.

Meetings, led by our two City Councillors, have been held to plan action on the A48, Catsash Road and other problem areas.

Following the inquest into the tragic death earlier this year of Miss Rhiannon Smith at the junction of Hendrew Lane with the A48, several changes will also be made in that area by NCC.

Defibrillators

In addition to the 2 defibrillators which have been installed at Llandevaud's old phone-box and at The New Inn, the Council has purchased 2 more units to be installed at the Old Barn at Llanmartin and at the Coldra Court Hotel. They should be installed in December. f you ever have the need to use them, the emergency operator will let you know what to do. We will be organising some first aid training to include the use of defibrillators which will be open to everyone in the new year. Please contact me if you would like to attend training and I'll let you know when it's organised.

Events

November saw our first Remembrance Service since the dedication of Langstone's new War Memorial. This made it very special and we overcame technical challenges to beam footage form the war memorial's wreath-laying ceremony to the service held at the village hall.

Christmas is our busiest events season and this year we will be organising a Seniors' Christmas Lunch at The Old Barn on 30th November and the Annual Christmas Concert on Sat 9th December 6.30 – 8.30pm at Langstone Village Hall. Do come and join us for this hugely popular FREE event!
