18/203 Chairman's Statement: The meeting would be run in accordance with LCC's Standing Orders.

18/204 Apologies were received from Cllr Griffiths.

18/205 There were no declarations of interest.

18/206 The minutes of the meeting held on 11th February 2019 and the Clerk's Report were approved.

18/207 Police

The two PCSOs present responded to queries from the public regarding anti-social behaviour and drug dealing in the park; off-road motor-cycles. Police had sent out an email re Operation Harley to tackle off-road motorcycling which was planned to take place this spring/summer.

18/208 Public Participation

Fly-tipping - One of the Council's Litter Defence stated that bathroom tiles had been fly-tipped in lay-by opposite crematorium – Clerk to report to NCC.

ACTION: HJ

Play park - Dog fouling in play-park had been very bad recently – residents asked if a section of the park could be sectioned off. The Council had previously discussed fencing off part of the park, but it had proved too expensive. To tackle the dog-fouling, offenders needed to be identified.

MUGA panel been damaged on 11th March. Clerk to report to NCC. ACTION: HJ

Fence panels require some maintenance. Clerk to contact WM for a quote to re-paint and to ask NCC if they inspect fences as part of their routine.

ACTION: HJ

There was some discussion re police role in tackling anti-social behaviour and drug-dealing. The police asked for people to let them know of any witnessed acts, including names/descriptions/car registration numbers if possible.

Cllr Routley said he would investigate with NCC the positioning of CCTV in the park which might deter / record offenders.

Road Safety Conference will take place on 11th October, hopefully at the new Celtic Manor Conference Centre. **20's Plenty** – 46 contacts now registered in Llandevaud. Contact with 20's Plenty was planned to determine the next steps. **Charity event** - Gwent Police Choir on 6th April at Usk Memorial Centre.

18/209 City Councillors

Cllr Mogford regretted that he was unable to attend this meeting.

Cllr Routley stated it was good to see the PCSOs walking through Langstone & Underwood on occasions.

White road-markings had been painted on the roads and roundabout on Priory Way.

Vehicle Activated Speed Signs – a question had been sent to NCC to ask why the promised data was not forthcoming.

Catsash Road legal notices set to be distributed. The whole Catsash Road area would become a 20mph zone. Speed limiting devices (speed bumps/chicanes) would be installed to reinforce the speed limit. Funding for the work (approx. £70k) had been obtained from The Celtic Manor Resort. Cllr Routley agreed to send a copy of the plan to the Clerk as soon as it was received.

18/210 Concurrent Allocation

The Council received an update on the legal case re judicial review of NCC's decision to withdraw concurrent contributions from community councils in 2019-20. The route of judicial review had not been possible due to time constraints. A further £5-10k would have been required to continue and the deadline for submission had passed before funding could be raised. It had therefore been decided to possibly pursue a complaint to the Public Services Ombudsman instead.

18/211 Representatives / Reports

Langstone Village Hall – The Clerk had circulated minutes from the last Trustees meeting on 4th March. The decorator hoped that he would be able to carry out painting during the Easter holidays. Storage is desperately needed - to be discussed further at the next Trustees' Meeting.

NCC – Next meeting 21st March. Clerk had submitted an agenda item regarding Community Council representation on Public Service Boards. Clerk to attend with Cllrs Bryant & Brown.

OVW - The Council resolved to rejoin One Voice Wales for 2019-20 at a cost of £461.

School – Clerk had circulated school newsletter.

Police Liaison – No informal meeting had taken place – Cllrs Lloyd & Brown to revive meetings ahead of Council meetings.

Community Speedwatch – evenings not yet light enough to conduct an exercise

- The Council resolved to seek a 30mph limit on the A48 from the Coldra roundabout to the Big Wall. The Council had requested this previously and been rejected. Council resolved to write to Andrew Jenkins at NCC to set up a discussion group.
- The Council resolved to seek to have a Pelican crossing installed on A48 possibly between the Coldra roundabout and Catsash Road. Clerk to add this to the letter to Andrew Jenkins.

Neighbourhood Watch - No report received

Llandevaud Parish Hall improvements – Meeting held 19th Feb. There had been some discussion of work to be done but no decisions were made. Estimates had been received for replacing the water main but the need to replace the current supply was still unclear.

Best Kept Village / planters / bee-friendly village — Tubs would be planted up with spring/summer plants soon. Planter had been moved from Hillcroft Garage to land in front of Germania. Old concrete planter from Germania had been moved to Llandevaud. Clerk to purchase green masonry paint to paint concrete planters. Trees had fallen in the recent storm on land owned by Ford Farm. Cllr Duthie stated that these would be removed.

ACTION: H

Play parks – Last year, the Council agreed to obtain new signage for the play parks. It had been agreed in a village postal survey that dogs should be banned from Poppy Park but allowed on leads into Centenary Field. Clerk to obtain quotations for new signage. There was some discussion re installing equipment for younger children. It was suggested that the problem of anti social behaviour needs to be tackled first.

ACTION: HJ

Environment (Litter, dog-fouling, verges) – Cllr Brown had carried out several litter picks and had seen a reduction in litter since clearing areas. He had also picked up after several dogs - Tregarn Road was particularly bad in this regard. A bin on Tregarn Road near school entrance might help in this regard. A bin had also been requested by litter volunteer at bus stop opposite Britannia Motors. Fly-tipping was common on Magor Road. The Clerk advised that NCC should be called by members of the public as they were quite responsive to clearing fly-tipping. Flymapper or FixMyStreet apps are useful as is NCC's app, MyNewport. The Council:

- Resolved to purchase 2 litter bins to match existing bins (Glasdon)
- Resolved to obtain stickers from dog wardens, and to produce flyers re dog-fouling
- Resolved to add £50 to a budget for a litter pickers' coffee morning
